

Course analysis BB1070 Genetik (6.0 hp), 2022

Background

The course was held remotely because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Last year (when the course was also held remotely), I recorded the lectures in advance, so that the students could see the videos, and I reused these videos this year. At the times scheduled for lectures I instead had "query sessions" via zoom. The literature seminars were done in groups of 4-5 as usual, but via zoom. The exam was a normal written exam, but the students had the opportunity to do an oral exam instead, which two students did.

Notably, also previous (pre-covid) years, the lectures (in class room) have included query sessions where the students could ask about unclear or complicated details. Therefore, the introduction of query sessions was not a major change of the course, the difference was that no lecture was held at the scheduled lecture times.

Furthermore, the course was originally designed to encourage self-studies, and to make it possible to study remotely without attending the lectures. Therefore, the transition to remote teaching has been relatively straightforward, and should not have severely affected the quality of the teaching.

Course analysis

The course analysis is based on a course evaluation given to the students at the exam. Out of the 50 students at the exam, 37 (74%) handed in the course

analysis. Thus, the **reply rate was 74%**, which is relatively high for a statistical survey, which should imply that the results reflect the students' opinion quite well.

What was good with the course?

At the zoom meetings with the students, comments about the course were generally very positive. They thought that the remote teaching worked quite well. The filmed lectures were appreciated. The students generally also appreciated (some were really enthusiastic) the literature seminars. On my question, the students generally thought that the study situation under the pandemic was OK, but that studying from home was more boring, they missed meeting people at school. Some thought they might be studying more because of less social diversions (fun stuff).

The students generally rate the overall quality of the course very highly, according to the Course evaluation handed out to the students. On the question "**How was the overall quality of the course?**" with the alternatives "Very good/Good/Acceptable/Not good/Bad", the students answered with the following frequencies: **16/16/5/0/0**.

Thus, 16 of the 37 students answering the course evaluation, **43%**, answered "**Very good**", implying that 43% of the students seem in principle totally satisfied with the quality of the course!

Five students (14%) did not rate the course as "Very good" or "Good", instead rating it as "Acceptable".

On a scale 1-5, setting "Bad" to 1 and "Very good" to 5, the **mean rating is 4.30**.

Thus, I conclude that the students are generally pleased with the course. It is notable that many students think that this course has a relatively heavy workload, but still think it is good!

In addition to my own questions, the course evaluation also included questions from the KTH Learning Experience Questionnaire (LEQ). Also the LEQ indicated a generally very successful course and satisfied students.

The scale for answers is 1-7 (1 = No, I strongly disagree; 4 = I neither agree nor disagree; 7 = Yes, I strongly agree).

For the three questions I think are the most important parameters, the answers from the students were very reassuring:

Question: "**The atmosphere in the course was open and inclusive**": Mean value **6.60**

Question: "**I understood how the course was organized and what I was expected to do**": Mean value **6.61**

Question: "**The course activities helped me to reach the learning objectives efficiently**": Mean value **6.12**

Thus, quite high values for these questions.

I am especially happy that the question "**The atmosphere in the course was open and inclusive**" got the high **mean value 6.60**. It is a major goal for me that the students feel well treated and have a good time in the course, since I think this is a very effective tool for the learning. I also think that it is important for any leader of a group of people to make sure that the group members are comfortable and feel well treated. The high score on this question indicates that I have created a good learning climate.

Furthermore, based on the high values on the two other questions: "**I understood how the course was organized and what I was expected to do**": mean value **6.61**, and "**The course activities helped me to reach the learning objectives efficiently**" mean value **6.12**, I draw the conclusion that my pedagogics, my deep learning design and my alignment of course activities and exam seems to work well!

Also the question "**I could get support if I needed it**" got a relatively high value, **6.59**. I actively try to make sure the students get the help and support they need: The students are encouraged to send emails with questions about things they need explained. These questions are then discussed at the next query session. I make sure to be available both before and after the query sessions (and pre-covid, the lectures) for questions. I am therefore happy to see that the students seem to be pleased with the amount of support they get from me and from also from other students.

To summarize, according to my own course evaluation and the KTH LEQ, the students are generally very satisfied with the course.

What was bad with the course?

Only 31 of the 50 students (62%) passed the exam. The number of students per grade was: 4 A; 11 B; 5 C; 7 D; 4 E; 4 Fx; 15 F.

This is the worst result ever for this course. It is notable that there was a distinct bimodal distribution of the results, with 15 students having A or B, and 15 having F. Thus, there were approximately as many students with good grades as previous years. The difference this year is the large number of students with F, 15 instead of the usual 4-5.

In the course evaluation, several students write that they did not watch the lecture videos. In my information to the students, I emphasized the importance of reading the course literature, and it seems some students thought the

recorded lectures were redundant. Next year I will make sure to tell the students both to read and to watch the lectures.

According to the LEQ, the students estimated that the mean time they have spent on studies on the course was 130 h (6hp corresponds to 160 h). This is less than the 135-145 h estimated most of the previous years.

Thus, a reason for the relatively bad results on the exam may be that some students spent too little time on studies for the course. Possibly, this is related to the covid situation, with somewhat depressed students, and the situation may hopefully be better after the pandemic.

What changes will be made until next time the course is given?

Because the pandemic is probably over, next year's course will be very different, changing from remote to in-place teaching. Most probably, the course will be different also compared to pre-covid times. I have no definite plans yet, but consider keeping filmed lectures instead of live ones, and instead use the scheduled lectures for query sessions, in principle flipped classroom.

The filmed lectures may have a good effect on the learning, since the students can listen to the lectures in their own pace. The backside is that it gets a bit boring, without opportunity for spontaneous questions and discussions. The questions can be discussed at the query sessions, but some spontaneity will obviously be lost.

According to the students' answers to the course evaluation, they generally seem to think my plan for next year is good.

Otherwise, the course has worked well during all previous years, so there is no reason to make any other major changes. However, the course is generally under constant development, especially concerning choice of additional texts for the seminars, and therefore changes are normally done each year.

Here follows the Course evaluation questionnaire given to the students, with results and my comments written in read:
