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DESCRIPTION OF THE COURSE EVALUATION PROCESS

The course was evaluated by means of the course questionnaire as well as an invitation to a student interview/feedback session. Unfortunately this year no students showed up to the feedback session and the questionnaire had very poor number of responses. Maybe this was due to the pandemic/remote setting and the timing of the questionnaire after the exams as well. For this reason, we unfortunately don't have meaningful statistics for this course round. Another aspect that contributed was that the number of students taking the course was significantly smaller due to the availability of course alternatives for the media technology students, starting this year.

The course was held in the same remote setup as the previous iteration due to caution over COVID-19. The course structure did not change relative to that iteration.

Some aspects that were highlighted:

- concern that the exam was requiring too many calculations. Teacher thoughts on this: I am not sure what the student here referred to unfortunately, as there were no significant calculations in the exam.

- lectures being a bit too long. Teacher thoughts: Regarding this, I agree and also think that listening to online lectures live for 2x45min is significantly more tiring than an in-real-life lecture. We are hoping to get back to classical lectures in the next iteration.
