

# Course analysis Signal Theory EQ1220, HT23

The course was given as in the previous years, but we replaced the reflective essays by reflective problem sets since with the availability of ChatGPT the reflective essay writing activity felt hard to ensure that students are not cheating and the main purpose of the activity is to make student work with the lecture content to get more familiar with the course content. Simple reflection problems were achieving this goal likewise, but we should do a minor revision of them to adapt to level of understanding where the students are at this point of time – some problems were perhaps still too difficult.

Students were actively participating in the course activities, primarily in the tutorials and projects. No changes are needed. However, there was a decay in the participation of the reflection lectures. This might be partially because students did not manage to keep the pace and the activity was not considered to be valuable. In the next course round, the reflection lectures should start earlier so that we lower the work intensity at the second half of the course when students do the second project, where I suspect that several students cannot keep the pace. This conclusion follows from the mentimeter questions at the beginning of each reflection lecture where I ask students if they managed to read and watch the corresponding material. The reflection lectures however also received most negative critique in the course feedback and I agree that there is room for improvement. Questions that just check definitions while they do not lead to some deeper understanding should be removed or revised to become more valuable focusing on understanding of concepts. One can try to have more discussions on the board providing better explanations of concepts.


We introduced in this course round two exam Q&A sessions (each 2h) before the exam and re-exam where students got the opportunity to meet the TAs and fellow students to ask questions. Several students took the opportunity and asked questions so that we should keep this offer, but one 2h session before each exam might be sufficient.

In the exam we made one difficult problem a bonus point problem. Students were able to show their problem-solving skills and got some extra points. We did this since we came up with the problem while we considered it to be too difficult as regular problem. If we have an idea of a problem which is considered to be too difficult, then this is an option to use it. It provides students just another opportunity to demonstrate their skills.

From personal exchange with students who took the course, I repeatedly hear that this course is the toughest course in the master program but also extremely valuable for the following studies. Since we try to do our best to help students to master the course, I do not plan to lower our expectations, but we will continue to try to look for more opportunities to improve the quality of our teaching. Since the course is already very developed with many learning activities, we will only do finetuning while the reflection lectures have the greatest potential for improvement.


The polar diagrams below show the average response to the LEQ statements for different groups of respondents (only valid responses are included). The scale that is used in the diagrams is defined by:

## **Learning factors from the literature that LEQ intends to examine**

We tend to learn most effectively (in ways that make a sustained, substantial, and positive influence on the way we think, reflect, act or feel) when:

- a) We are trying to answer questions, solve problems or acquire skills that we find interesting, exciting or important
- b) We are able to speculate, test ideas (intellectually or practically) and learn from experience, even before we know much about the subject
- c) We are able to do so in a challenging and at the same time supportive environment
- d) We feel that we are part of a community and believe that other people have confidence in our ability to learn
- e) We understand the meaning of the intended learning outcomes, how the environment is organized, and what is expected of us
- f) We have adequate prior knowledge to deal with the current learning situation
- g) We are able to learn inductively by moving from concrete examples and experiences to general principles, rather than the reverse
- h) We are challenged to develop a true understanding of key concepts and gradually create a coherent whole from the content
- i) We believe that the work we are expected to do will help us to achieve the intended learning outcomes
- j) We are able to try, fail, and receive feedback before, and separate from, each summative assessment of our efforts

k) We believe that our work will be considered in an honest and fair way

l) We have sufficient time for learning and devote the time needed to do so

- m) We believe that we have control over our own learning, and not that we are being manipulated
- n) We are able to collaborate with other learners struggling with the same problems



### Average response to LEQ statements - per gender







I found the two-hour true or false lecture not very useful. There were too many YouTube ads on your video. At least 3x40 sec during a 15 min video

Maybe the course can introduce more guest lectures from industry areas in the future. Because the context of this course seems too theoretical, I think we can learn some true application in industry areas to strengthen our understanding.  
The online lecture is not suitable for this lesson as it highly relies on mathematics. Besides, the answers to the reflective lecture's problems may contribute to the revision. Markov chain is anticipated.  
In reflection lecture, I think it can add something just like an exercise or an example after each statement.

What would you suggest to improve? (I worked: 18-20 timmar/vecka)

I studied mostly by the textbook since the videos did not help me to understand the concepts. The textbook is well structured and concepts are well explained. I think I would structure (video) lectures according to the book and highlight the most important ideas. Furthermore, the reflection lectures can be improved, e.g. by studying related problems and then concluding to basic concepts before or after solving those. At least I learn best by solving problems and then circle back to the important concepts.

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
