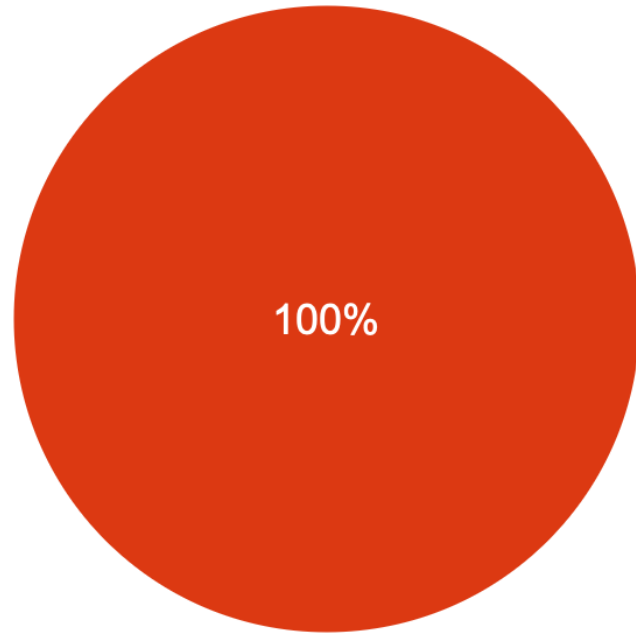

I find the length of each seminar (2 presentations)

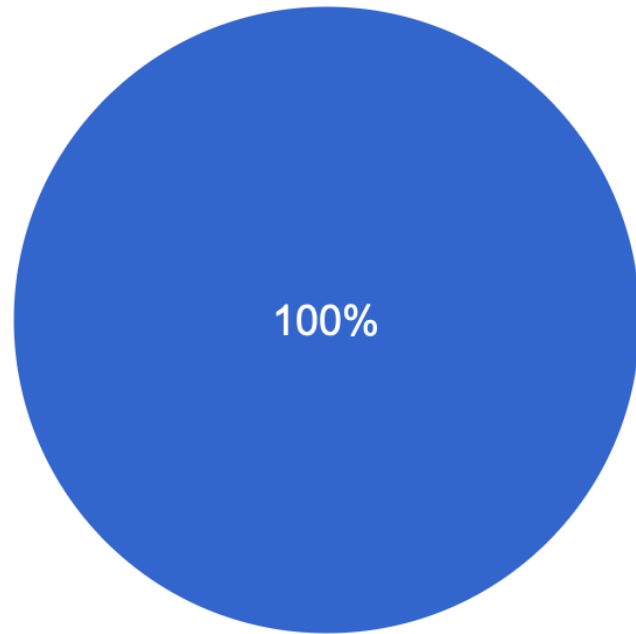

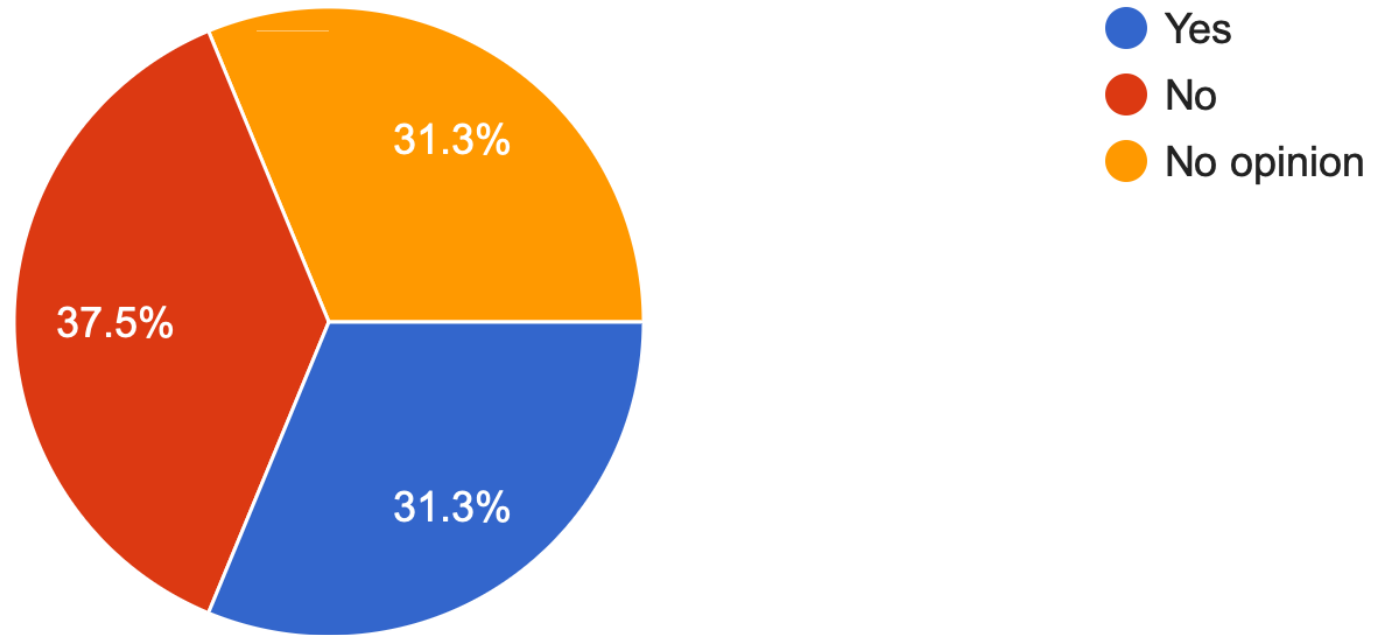

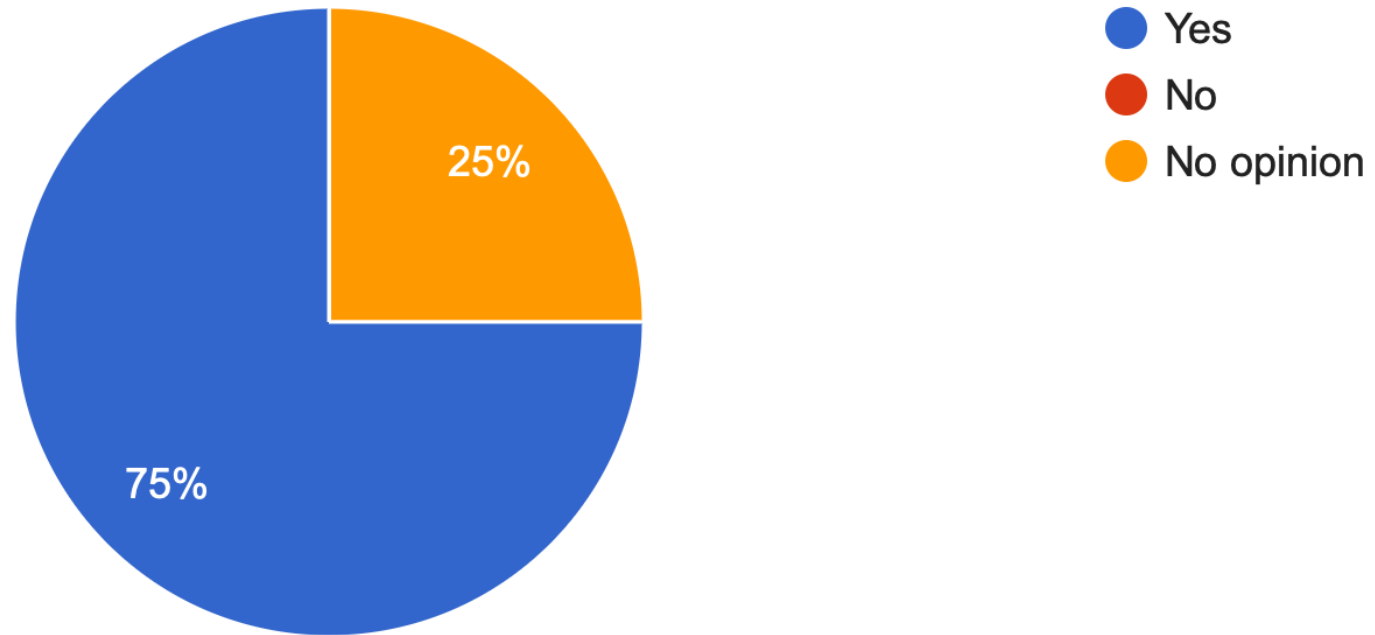
Should the chair participate at the feedback session?

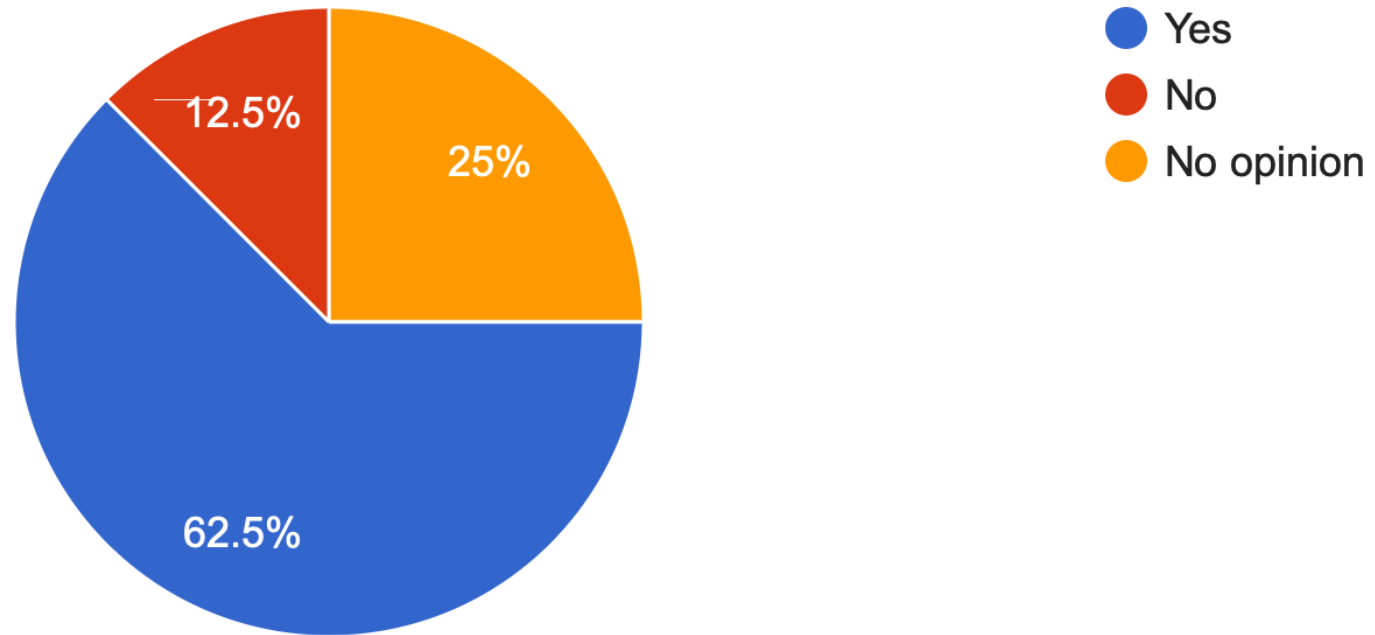
Should we continue with a postdoc session on one occasion?

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I think it would be best to remove Zoom entirely. It often makes a mess when it doesn't work and it just feels like a way to get attendance and not really listen to what the speakers are saying. I would prefer to do the presentations without; it is a "club" after all.

I don't mind the hybrid format (zoom) as such, but I think it could be working better. There is quite often some technical issues over zoom. My suggestion would be that the chair person takes on some more responsibility here, setting up his/her computer beforehand (avoiding the need of exchanging computer in the middle of Protein Club) and checking that everything works with screen sharing and zoom. The presenters could be asked to send the presentations latest 1 hour before, so the chair have some time for this.

Just improve the technology, i.e. the projector in the lunch room since the colors are always off and it makes the presentations look very strange at times.

Maybe a 5 min pause before the feedback session since people from the audience usually have more questions and wants to talk to you right after the presentations and it's nice to have some time to do that to get additional tips and feedback about your research

the presentation occasions should be fairly divided among the students, maybe everyone should just get 3 occasions per year?

To make sure that the other person presenting is from outside of the group so you get that important view on your presentation/research.

Nothing in particular. When possible space for post doc sessions or sessions from researchers at the floor is always interesting

Reagrding zoom and chair. If zoom is to be kept I would suggest that the chair is responsible for having set up zoom/projector and that speakers are required to send their slides to the chair one hour (or similar) before the presentation. This would ensure that the tech is working as intended. Think of it as soundcheck.

I think for the most part the course does exactly what it sets out to do.

I think the chair can have more clear instructions (presenting the speakers, time keeping, checking zoom, asking own questions if there are none from the audience). In addition, is there a good solution to the very interesting post-protein club discussions when the audience come up to the speakers after the presentation but before the feedback, that takes away time from the feedback session?
