

# Course Analysis for IV1351, Data Storage Paradigms, Period 2 2021

April 29, 2022

## **1 Notes from course evaluation board**

Unfortunately no one wanted to participate in the course evaluation board.

## **2 Course evaluation**

The LEQ questionnaire unfortunately only got 8 answers, which corresponds to just 6% of the participants. It's therefore hardly meaningful to draw conclusions based on the evaluation. What can be said, is that the few who answered appreciated the course. All of the 22 evaluated points got five or higher on the seven-graded scale, and 14 points got six or higher. The complete results of the evaluation can be found in appendix 1.

The "best aspects" of the course mentioned in the evaluation are the project, the recorded lectures, and the interaction with the teachers. The suggested improvements are to emphasize the amount of work required for the project, to require more from students attending seminars, and to better explain how the lectures are relevant for the project.

## **3 Changes since previous course round**

The main differences concern the project. First, it was a bit simplified since the workload was very high last year. Second, there were help sessions and seminars where the students could get help and feedback from teachers, and also discuss their solutions with other students. Third, it was allowed to work in pairs. All of this was appreciated and will be kept.

## 4 Pass Rate

- 124 participants were registered for the first time and 33 participants were re-registered, which makes a total of 157 participants.
- 139 of the 157 registered participants actually participated, the remaining 18 didn't submit anything at all during the entire course.
- 95 participants (68% of the 139 participants) passed the TEN1 sub-course.
- 57 participants (41% of the 139 participants) passed the LAB1 sub-course.
- 58 participants (42% of the 139 participants) completed the course.
- The final grades were distributed as follows.

The pass rate is very low, which is mainly because too few pass the LAB1 subcourse, which in turn is because too few pass the project. It's also quite remarkable that fewer passed the LAB1 subcourse this course round than the previous course round, when the changes were to reduce the LAB1 subcourse and to provide more help to the participants.

## 5 Improvements for next course round

Something must be done to improve the pass rate. One possibility is to reduce the project even further, or maybe to completely remove it. Another possibility is to give students the opportunity, or even make it mandatory, to report the project tasks one by one, during the course, as they are completed. Now the entire project is reported at the end of the course, which leads to many participants starting project work too late. It must be noted, however, that also last course round the project was reported only at the end, and that time the pass rate was about ten percent higher. Another complicating factor is that there must be more teachers to give time for continuous examination of the project.

A third possibility to improve the pass rate is to provide more tutorials or help sessions. It's however very uncertain if that would help, since there was very low attendance on help sessions this course round. Also, the pass rate was higher last course round when there were no help sessions at all.

Perhaps the truth is that the course has low pass rate since many students take another, very demanding, course in parallel. That was at least suggested by course participants. If that's the case there isn't much to do about the pass rate, except to reduce course content even further.

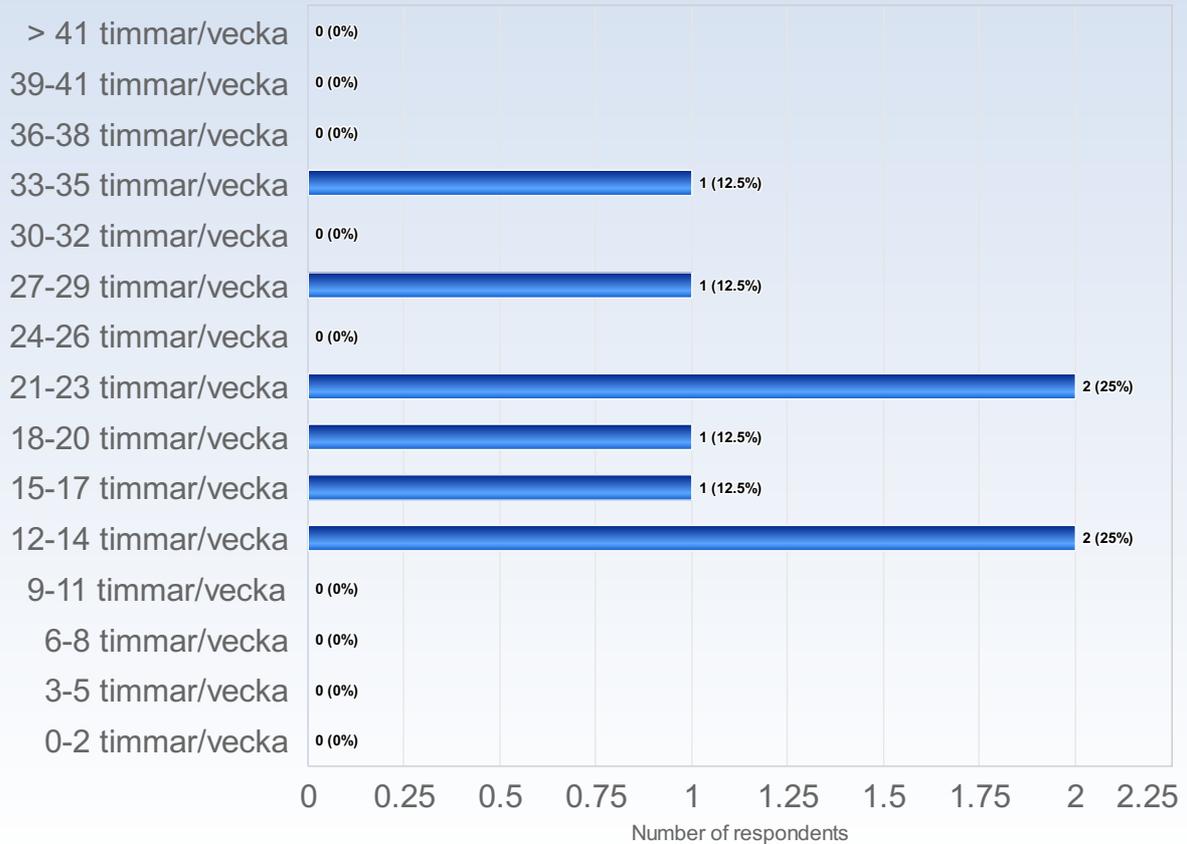

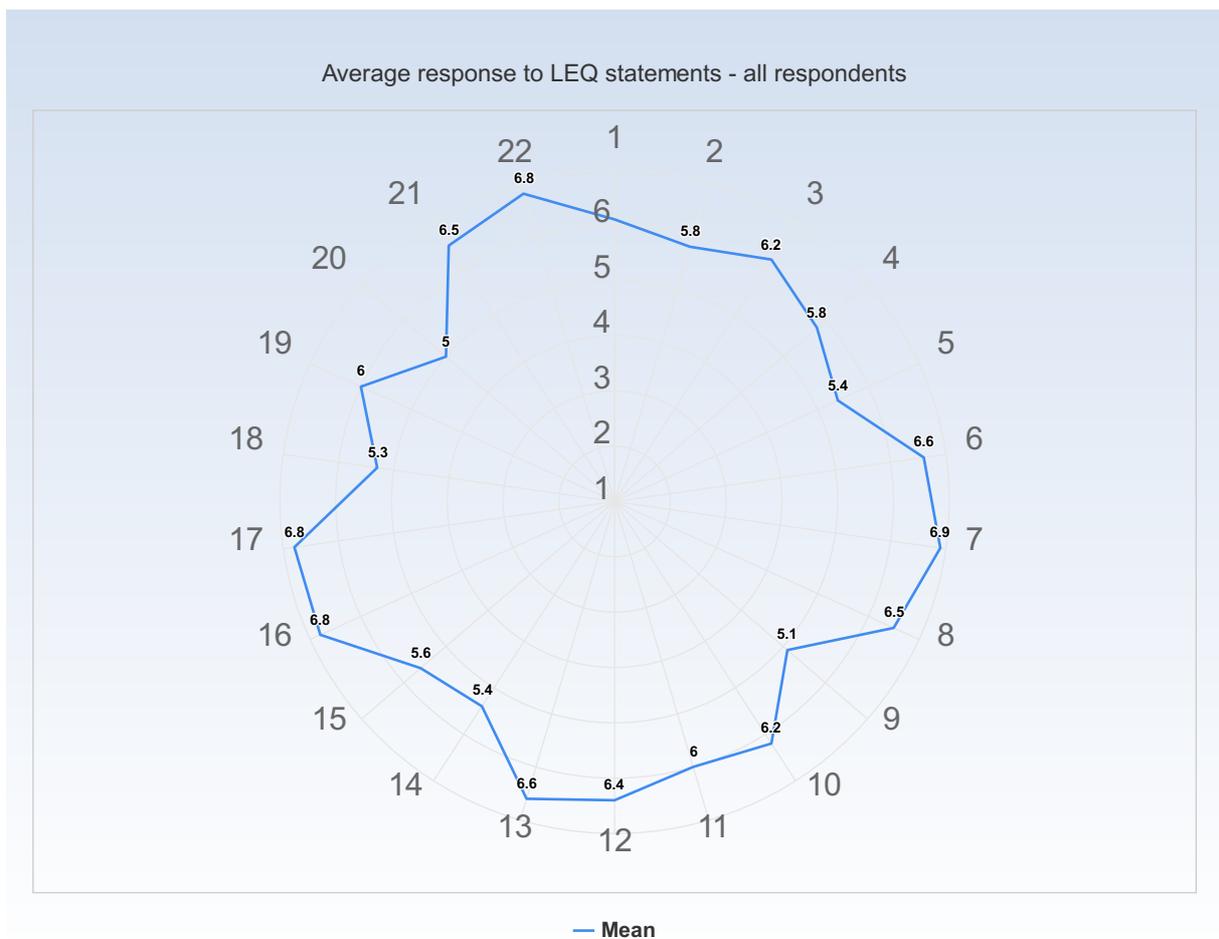

c) We are able to do so in a challenging and at the same time supportive environment

d) We feel that we are part of a community and believe that other people have confidence in our ability to learn

e) We understand the meaning of the intended learning outcomes, how the environment is organized, and what is expected of us

f) We have adequate prior knowledge to deal with the current learning situation

g) We are able to learn inductively by moving from concrete examples and experiences to general principles, rather than the reverse

h) We are challenged to develop a true understanding of key concepts and gradually create a coherent whole from the content

i) We believe that the work we are expected to do will help us to achieve the intended learning outcomes

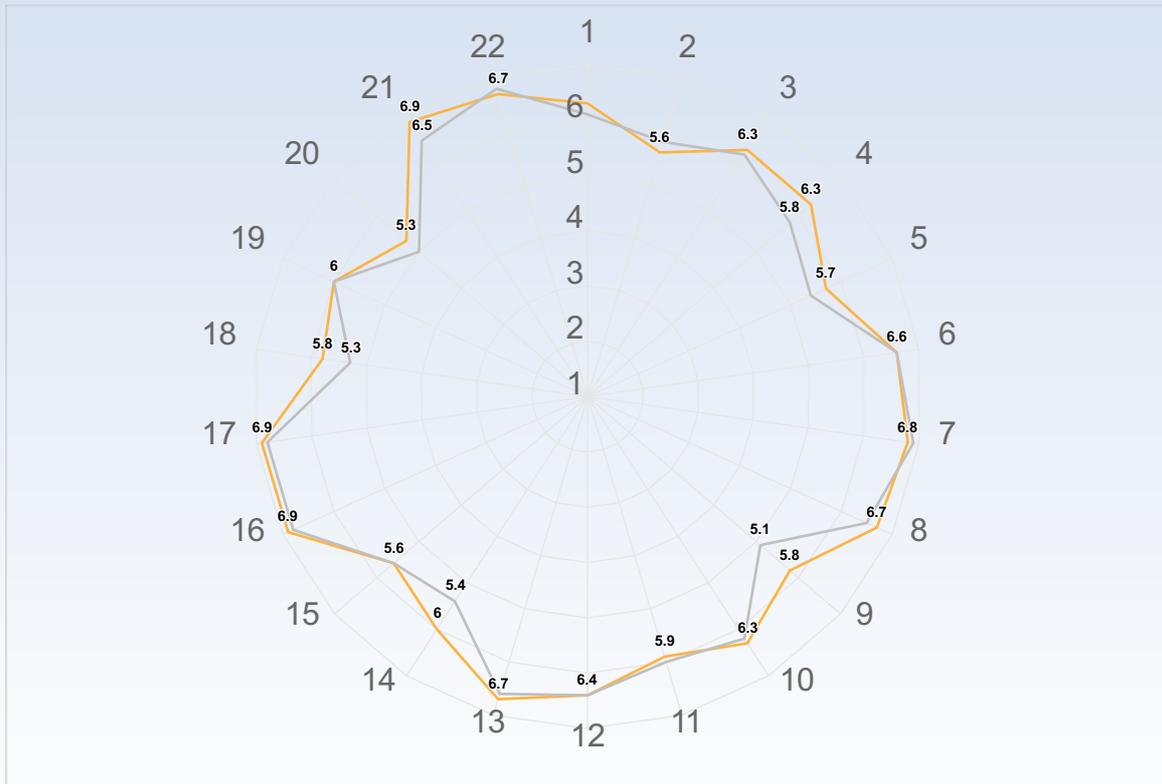

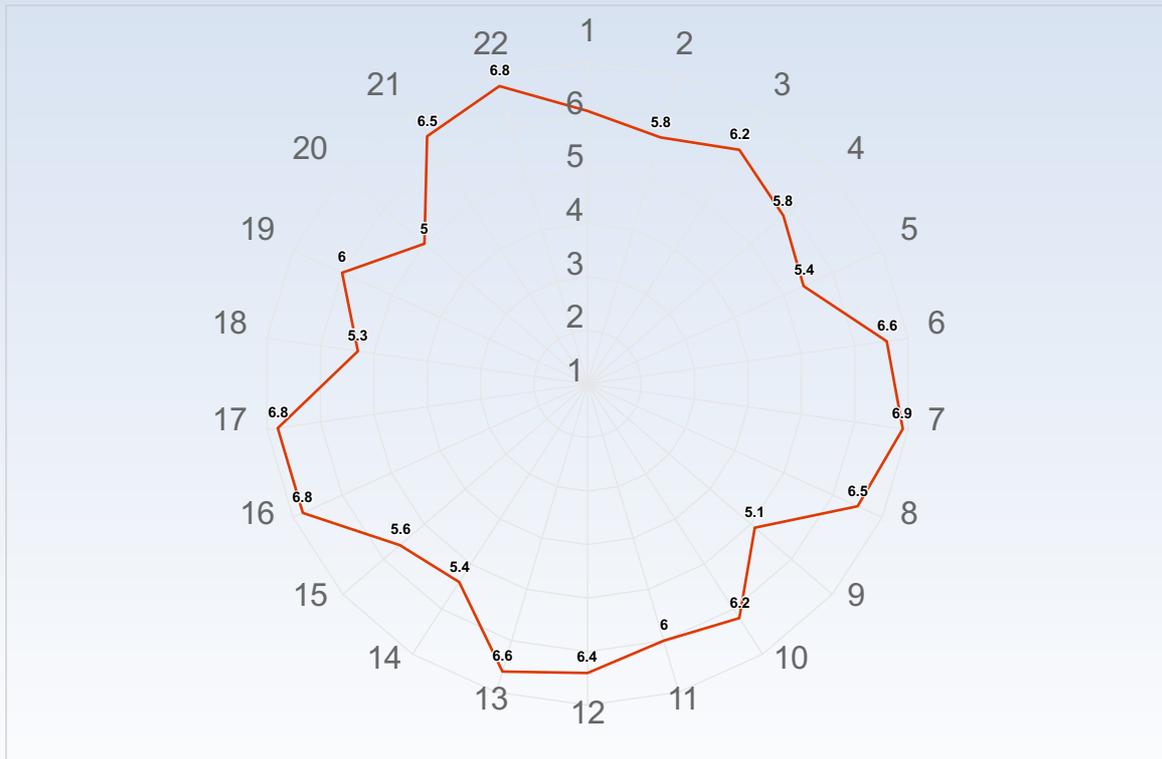
Average response to LEQ statements - per gender

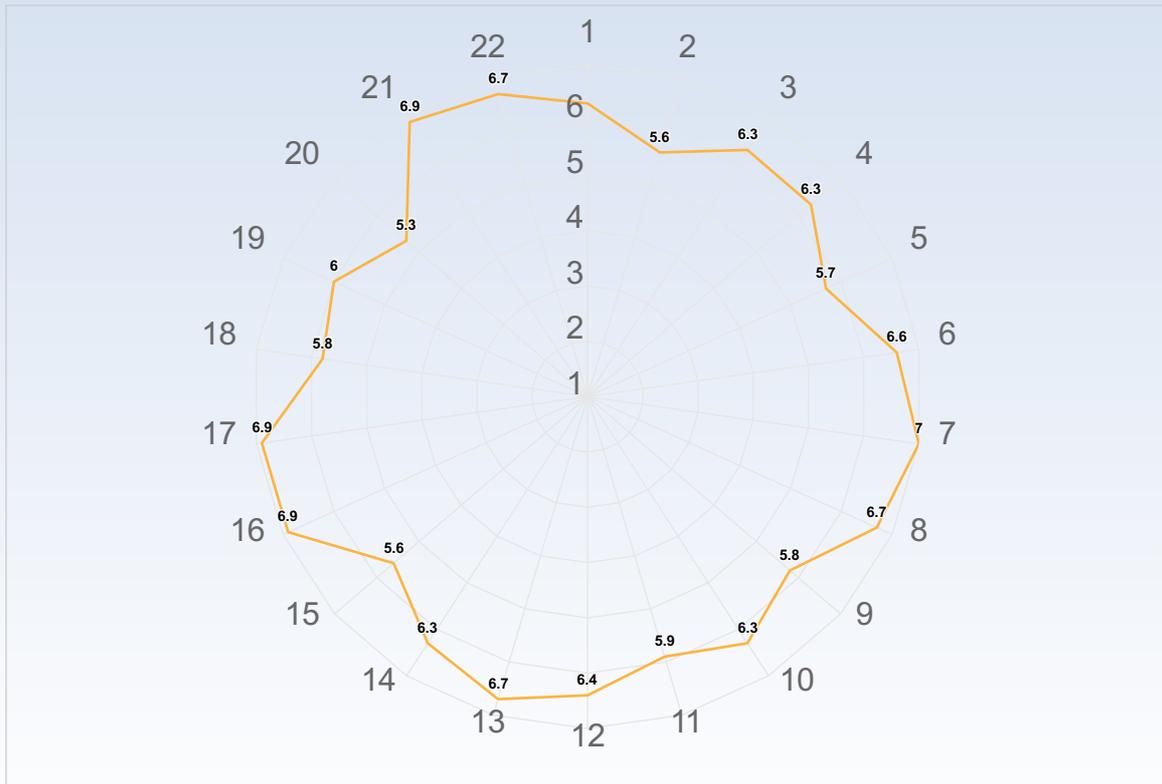
Average response to LEQ statements - per type of student
